The Superiority of <u>Scripture</u> (Part #1)

¹⁶ All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (ESV)

1. What Scripture claims about itself:

A. All Scripture is <u>inspired</u>. What this doesn't mean:

*It doesn't mean that God always <u>dictated</u> the material.

*It doesn't mean that human authors introduced personal <u>error</u> into the text.

*It doesn't mean that some <u>Scripture</u> is inspired while other parts are not.

*It doesn't mean that only the <u>ideas</u> are inspired.

B. All Scripture is <u>inerrant</u>. What this does mean:

*Only the original <u>autographs</u> are completely inerrant.

*It does not eliminate <u>figures</u> of speech.

*It does not eliminate <u>approximations</u> and loose quotations.

*It does not contain <u>contradictions</u>.
